

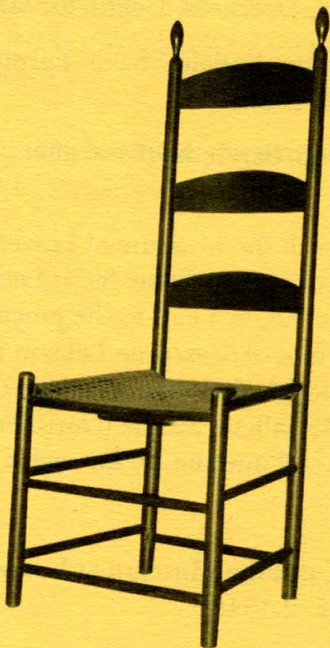

#### SHAKER JOINERY IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

will be explored on Saturday, April 12 with Scott T. Swank, Director of Canterbury Shaker Village, Canterbury, New Hampshire; Jean M. Burks, Curator of Decorative Arts at the Shelburne Museum, Shelburne, Vermont, who is co-author with Timothy D. Rieman of *The Complete Book of Shaker Furniture*; and Philip Zea, Deputy Director and Curator of Historic Deerfield, Inc., Deerfield, Massachusetts. The program will focus on the furniture and architecture of the New Hampshire Shaker communities at Enfield and Canterbury. Participants will hear lectures on the design, construction, and uses of Shaker furniture and buildings. They will also take part in a workshop that explores the construction characteristics of New Hampshire Shaker furniture. Museum staff will offer a walking tour of the Church and North Family communities along the shores of Mascoma Lake at the Enfield Shakers' *Chosen Vale*.

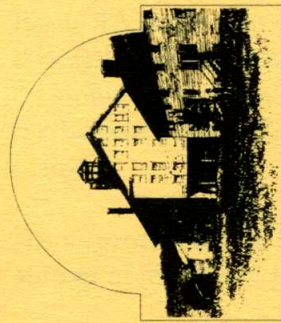
